## DISK-OF-THE-MONTH FEBRUARY 1990

The purpose of this software is to HELP organize your home. Jan's family helped design the material involved. The "Templates" (blank forms) are designed on TI-Writer and can be altered, or used in that form. The forms can be printed out on your own printer. How many is up to you. The sheets are designed for standard 8 1/2 x 11 paper. There is enough room on the left margin so that holes can be punched and the end product will fit in a standard school binder.

Templates are not a fixed mode but a B/V 00 file. What this means to you is that it can easily be altered for your own personal needs. REMEMBER! If you decide to alter or print onto the forms TAKE THE WORD WRAP OFF. If you reformat the file it will become a jumble. Insert and delete can be used if done so carefully. Remember to balance. If you delete on one side you must insert on the other or the grid will not be aligned. This is not true of all charts, only those that a standard grid is used. It sounds much more complicated than it really is. You load a template the same as any B/V 00 file. Once loaded you can alter the charts or just send the data to your printer. You can even use them with the TI-Writer for a nice typewritten appearance.

The following is a disk directory and a brief description of what is on the various files. I hope you will enjoy!

KIDS/AP - PROGRAM (public domain) ALLOWANCE PLANNER.  
LABELMAKER - PROGRAM (public domain) for 5 line labels.  
LEDGER - TEMPLATE for household ledger.  
LOAD - PROGRAM that anteloads.  
MEDICAL - TEMPLATE for medical history.  
NOTES - TEMPLATE for personal notes.  
PHONEBOOK - TEMPLATE for directory pages.  
RECIPT - TEMPLATE for household receipts.  
REMINDER - TEMPLATE for birthdays and anniversaries.  
TEMPLATES - ARTICLE on how to make your own templates.  
TODAY - TEMPLATE for daily reminders.  
WARRANTY - TEMPLATE for warranty inventory.

DOEs are available FREE to SYSSers attending the membership meeting each month. If you are unable to attend the meeting, members may buy DOEs for \$1, either at a later meeting or by mail (no extra cost by mail).

A. Type "LF", press (enter), then load in the first page. Type "LF" again, then type "F", space, and DEL (same file name). The second page will be tacked onto the end of the first page, in the new file.

## FAIRWARE OF THE MONTH DISK UTILITIES



Disk Utilities is one the best and perhaps the most user friendly of the Disk Editor/"Fixer" type programs. We have decided to pay honor to John Birdwell for his wonderful program. Unfortunately, John Birdwell died December 27, 1990 and therefore the honor we pay is post humously.

When Jack Mathis demonstrates how to fix "blown" disks he will also be demonstrating Disk Utilities. If you use this program (and most of us will at one time or another), you should pay for it.

I am including below an article written by Don Jones about John Birdwell. I hope the money you donate for Disk Utilities will help the American Cancer Society to find a cure that will save others, in John's position.

## JOHN BIRDWELL - IN MEMORIAM

On December 27, 1990, John Edward Birdwell died as the result of cancer of the liver. He is survived by his wife Kathy and his two children, Kelly and Kristin. His family has requested that any donations, in his name, may be made to the American Cancer Society, 999 North Main Street, Glen Ellyn, IL 60137.

With the death of Jon Birdwell, the 4A/9640 community has lost one of its most important programmers and advocates. Several of his early programs are still in our users group's library, and in addition to these there are some other programs which have been very important and significant to our community. The first of his programs to have wide popularity within the 4A/9640 community was his Disk Utilities Program (DISKUT); John also wrote HENV for the Hyarc HFDC card. Before John's leaving, he was working on a program which was supposed to be released through JP Software: "Disk One." This program was supposed to be a manager/editor for both floppy and hard disks. (At this point, there is no confirmation as to whether or not he was able to finish this program before his passing.) And at one time, he was working on the software for a streamer tape back-up for the Hyarc HFDC card.

The above facts are easy to express, but it is very difficult to express our feelings of regret over John's untimely passing. Already, expressions of grief and sympathy are coming forth from various sectors of our

community. John left behind many fine examples of programming, and for this reason, he will never be forgotten. But we of the Chicago Group have had the opportunity to benefit directly from John's willingness to share his knowledge and to give help to those of us who were often in need. John Birdwell was not only an exceptional programmer, but he was also an exceptional human being. Both reasons are sufficient to ensure that though he will not be with us, his memory will be kept alive by those of us who were honored to both know and work with him.

## CACTUS PATCH POLICIES

I felt this would be a good time to put into print the policies as listed on Cactus Patch. These policies are always subject to change, but they have been fairly constant for the last 4 months. Some changes were implemented this month due to the high volume of usage Cactus Patch has been experiencing.

To give you an idea, Cactus Patch (as of 1/23/91) has had over 5500 calls. The number of messages left are now at 7500 (only the last 200 are on the system at any one time). We now have 99 users, with a maximum capacity of 200. There are about 75 TI/Geneve users logged on. The rest are scattered among IBM/Clones, Apples, Itaris, Commodores, and Tandys. At present there are about 25 user group members logged onto Cactus Patch, with some being quite active, and others, well, we haven't heard from them for months.

We also have a large number of out of state callers, and 2 from Canada. We have in the past even had one from Japan! We have callers from all parts of the country, from New England, the Southeast, the Midwest, the Far West, etc. It is because of this heavy usage of Cactus Patch that a definitive policy is needed. Every user is expected to read this policy and adhere by it. As of this point in time, I have only had to delete 2 TI'ers, and about a dozen non-TI'ers for violating the policy.

If, at any time, any user has any questions as to the policy, they are free to leave me a message on Cactus Patch and I will clarify the policy for them. Now for the Policy File as it is on Cactus Patch:

\*Last revision date: January 23, 1991

Cactus Patch BBS is sponsored by the SouthWest Ninety Niners User Group of Tucson, Arizona. Cactus Patch is operated by and for the enjoyment and pleasure of its members, plus to allow the SW9906 to communicate with Texas Instrument User Groups across the country and other user groups to communicate with the SW9906.

The following policies as outlined below, are subject to change without notice. The SysOp of Cactus Patch will be the final determiner in the enforcement of the Cactus Patch Policies.

1) All computers are welcome on Cactus Patch. However, Non-TI'ers will not be allowed to upload any non-TI files.

2) User access levels:

**RESTRICTED:** All first time users, and those who abuse their privileges on Cactus Patch.

**VALIDATED:** All users who do not merit one of the other levels.

**SPECIAL:** All users who are members in good standing of the SouthWest Niners User Group. Also, officers of other TI User Groups.

**PRIVILEGED:** SouthWest Ninety Niner User Group officers and SysOps from other TI BBS systems.

**SYSOP:** The Cactus Patch SysOp and Co-SysOps, the President of the SouthWest Niners User Group, and the Co-Authors of Paradigm BBS (PBBS), Tom Wills, Mike Kibble, and Travis Watford.

3) Users will be dropped from the Cactus Patch caller list if they meet the following levels of sustained inactivity by access level:

**RESTRICTED:** Seven days.

**VALIDATED:** 30 days for non-TI'ers, and 90 days for TI'ers.

**SPECIAL:** Never, while a member in good standing of SW9906. Six months for non-SW9906 members.

**PRIVILEGED:** Never for current SW9906 officers. Six months for all others.

**SYSOP:** Never.

**\*\*NOTE:** It is up to the sole discretion of the SysOp whether to reduce or extend the above time periods\*\*

4) Handles will **\*NOT\*** be allowed. Any user signing on with a handle will be deleted immediately!!

5) Only Public Domain OR Fairware file uploads will be allowed to be on this BBS system. No obscene uploads will be permitted (with the SysOp having the final say as to what is considered obscene).

If the user is in doubt as to whether a file is PD or Fairware, please check with the SysOp BEFORE uploading the file.

If long distance callers want to upload a file they are not sure of, they may do so, but they are to leave a message to the SysOp via Email or Feedback that they have done so. No user will be disciplined in this instance.

6) The following constitutes abuse of user privileges on Cactus Patch:

- Profanity
- Knowingly uploading commercial products
- Trying to crash the system

Users will be given a second chance before being lowered to **RESTRICTED** status. The one exception to this is trying to crash the system, which will result in immediate deletion from the Cactus Patch user list.

The preceding is subject to change without notice. The current policy is preliminary and is still to be finalized.

## HYARC UPDATE

Finally, some good news about Hyarc! I received my Hard and Floppy Disk Controller Card (HFDC). Not only did I get my HFDC, but so did Dale Ussery! There was some mixup with Dale's order, no fault of Hyarc, but once that was cleared up, Dale received his HFDC also. And, the best news of all, they both work!

However, we must point out one problem that both Dale and I ran into. We both had minor problems with the edge connectors. The cable connector when pushed on all the way didn't seem to make a proper contact. A little jiggling, and we both were in business. I tried to call Hyarc on this minor problem, and got the proverbial answering machine.

At this point in time, it does appear that Hyarc is indeed in business. Dale and I both ordered our HFDC's from TH

Direct Product Marketing in California. TH had the drives in stock. The price is \$199 plus shipping and handling, which was a reasonable amount. From the time I placed my order until I received shipment was one week. Impressive!

Now that I have the HFDC, I can modify the Paradigm BBS software to run the newest version (v4.00) on the hard disk.

But, I must make these comments about Hyarc. I am in complete agreement with NICKOPENDIUM when they stated in their editorial that Hyarc should release technical information about the Geneve and the HFDC. Let third party programmers complete the EDOS, and whatever else is desired. Let Hyarc be strictly a hardware company. If third party developers are allowed to complete EDOS, thus stabilizing this most important software, the Geneve will rebound from its doldrums. And by doing this, Hyarc will sell more Geneves and HFDC's, which means more income to Hyarc. Granted, they will never be a big computer company like Texas Instruments, but they will improve their financial condition, and become a much stronger force in the TI community.

So much for the soapbox. If anything of importance in the world of Hyarc develops, I will be certain to pass along this important information.

## CONFIGURING FUNNELWEB THE QUICK & DIRTY WAY

TI Express by Patrick Powell



First, Function 9 and Control C both act as a return mode. Second, prompts require just a single key press and are the first letter of the prompt name. (E for Edit etc...). With that out of the way let's configure away!!!!

Loading: Load configure (filename CF) either from main Ibasic screen or OPT #5 from E/A module. The first screen will be the Configure title screen. Already you have 3 options to contend with: First, is ? which pops up a help screen. This command will also work at all screens where you must make a choice. Second, FUNCTION 7 will display a Disk Directory of a drive. And, finally by hitting any other key you'll get to the next screen. (NOTE THIS IS A STEP BY STEP INSTRUCTION. IF YOU NEED MORE INFO I SUGGEST YOU READ THE DOCS FROM THE FUNNELWEB PACKAGE.)

Y info

Next you choose between load E dit S ave. load the info into memory. You will be prompted for the location of the STSCON file after this is filled in correctly, hit enter.

[ dit.... AND NOW THE FUN STARTS!!!!!!!

loading- this will bring up a window for changing the loading info for FunnelWeb.

out Loading is used if you want FunnelWeb to follow the disk drive from where you loaded FunnelWeb originally. If you intend for FunnelWeb to only look for specific files on specific drives then use until OFF is displayed.

I-Writer Side and A Side These #'s should correspond to the drive that FunnelWeb files are located on. If the TI-writer files are on a separate disk than the EA files then correct the # for these drives. If both sets of files are on the same drive then use the same # for both prompts.

orking Drive-I usually leave this blank.

mediate. This tells FunnelWeb how a return to FunnelWeb is wanted when coming back to the FunnelWeb environment (i.e. returning from MSX or DR-1000) this also is how FunnelWeb is entered when you load FunnelWeb from E/A (using PW or UTIL as the E/A loader). Hitting cycles through 3 choices. 1: DR reloads Disk Review immediately. 2: UL loads the UL list that you create. 3: PW loads the TI Writer Menu. Choose whatever you like.

ard Disk path is if you have a Hard Drive. Now go Back (Control-C or Function-9).

ervices: This is where you set up your printer and files names. E dtr Printer sets the parameters for the PF command of the editor as well as the P command of Disk Review. E rmt Printer Sets the parameters for the Formatter (I use PIO and PIO.LF respectively). I generally leave Object File and Program File blank. For ork file I enter MSX2. so that when I do a SF from the editor all I need to enter is the filename. Put whatever you like here. After you finish here Control-C or Function-9.

colors sets up your screen and character colors for FunnelWeb. I like the ones that came with FunnelWeb, I left mine alone.

enu: I Writer this sets up the TI Writer menu screen you have the choices of [ dit, ack, edo, ext in the remaining menus: [ dit allows you to change the info. edo returns bar to top of menu, ack moves bar up one space. ext goes down one space. Remember these files must be E/A loaded and the actual filename should be 2 characters long. [ dit title name. Then hit (enter) next enter Filename (enter) finally use arrow keys to move bar to the program type that loads your file then hit (enter) again. FYI ANYTHING THAT YOU WANT TO APPEAR ON THE F COMMAND OF DISK REVIEW SHOULD BE IN EITHER THE TI WRITER MENU OR THE E/A MENU. After you have made the changes you desire go back and choose E/A menu make changes in the same way as above. Then go back twice to come to the selection screen.

ain Menu. This is where you can change the Main title

screen. Also this is where Extended Basic Programs load from. Now you are given a couple of new options. You first should [etch the old menu you will be prompted for the location of the LOAD Program for FunnelWeb. After this is loaded you can [eserve which puts into memory the original menu. [change allows you to go back and forth between the menu you are editing and the one stored in memory. [ brings up the menu. Using the arrow keys you can scan down the menu and when you come to something you want to change press [dit. Now the first thing you need to do is to create a title name for your file (I'll use DN-1000) press (enter) and you need to choose [oot Tracking. If off, it will require you to specify what drive the file will be located in. If ON it will boot from the drive FunnelWeb was loaded from. Hitting [eninder will cycle between YES and NO, i.e. if you answer YES then FunnelWeb will ask you for the disk to be inserted for this program every time you try to load it (handy for those who have csc drive or more than one FunnelWeb disk) if the answer is NO then FunnelWeb assumes that the file is located on the disk that FunnelWeb is booted from. (Enter) moves you to the next part.

Enter the Filename for this particular file. Using DN-1000 I would enter BS if Boot Tracking was on, or BSX4.BS where # is the drive that BS file is located on. Notice, if Boot Tracking is on, there is no need to enter the BSX prompt. (enter) Now you use the arrow keys to move the bar to the file loading type. When you are in the correct area (R/A Program for my BS file) hit enter. NOTE Only in this menu can you access the IBasic Loader. When finished use Control-C or Function-9 to go back.

[ L List: This will allow you to change the UL file as well as the create any other UL file you wish. The directions are the same as for The IB menu except you must [etch each list individually and must [ave each list individually. By creating more than one UL file and giving them different names you can string them together Using Next list as a File and calling the next file. Again, only R/A files can be loaded from this file. Remember to [ave each list. After you are finished with the UL and saved the UL file(s) Control-C or Function-9 until you return to the Sysinfo Menu of [dit [oad [ave. Now, you will want to [ave the changes so hit [ave and fill in the prompt for where the SYCON file is located. (Note the SYCON file should be on the Main FunnelWeb disk but after you are through configuring you can leave of the CP and CG files to conserve disk space). Hit (enter) and wait for the screen to come back to the Sysinfo menu. Now Control-C or Function-9 to the [ @ nit [n stall screen and Hit Install. You now will be asked for ID-Load or FW/UTIL1 -Load. [ain ID and enter where the LOAD file is (enter) then when the targeted filename is requested hit (enter) again. When this is through you should save the information to either a [ V or UTIL1 file for R/A loading of FunnelWeb, if you choose not to then Control-C or Function-9 and hit [ nit then reset the

computer and reboot FunnelWeb and see if it all works well. This text was written as a brief quick and dirty outline for configuring FunnelWeb 4.31 and by all means is not a complete tutorial. Basically I wrote this as a companion to my demoing the Configuring of FunnelWeb for our Users Group. If any other group wishes to reprint this then go for it. All I ask is for proper credit and a copy of the newsletter that this is printed in.

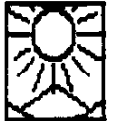

The SouthWest Ninety-Niners is a Computer Users Group formed to promote the use of the TI-99/4A and compatibles. We are not affiliated or sponsored by Texas Instruments. Membership is \$20 per year for non-U.S. members. For U.S. members the first year is \$20 and renewal is \$15 per year.

The membership fee pays for printing and mailing the newsletter which is published 12 times per year.
